



VERMONT

Vermont is the 6th smallest in area and the 2nd least populous of the 50 United States. It is the only New England state not bordering the Atlantic Ocean.

Aside from the Thirteen Colonies, Vermont is one of only four U.S. states (along with Texas, Hawaii, and California) to have been a sovereign state in its past. In 1791, Vermont joined the United States as the 14th state, the first in addition to the original 13 Colonies.

The state capital is Montpelier with a population of 7,855. Vermont's most populous city is Burlington, with a 2010 population of 42,417.

Vermont is a great place to practice driving. The Vermont Tour takes us through seven scenarios such as driving to school, picking someone up, looking for a parking spot, and visiting the State Capital. In these drives, we get to experience Burlington, Montpelier, and Northfield – and drive across three covered bridges!

While you should always be looking for each of the eleven critical items, in these drives, pay particular attention to pedestrians, turning vehicles, bicyclists, traffic lights and brake lights.
